Signs of an Opioid Overdose

A person might be having an opioid overdose if they:

- → Are known to use opioids
- → Will not wake up, even when you shake them
- → Are breathing slowly or not at all

- → Have lips or fingernails that are blue or gray-colored
- → Have clammy or pale skin

IF YOU SEE THESE SIGNS, IT MAY BE AN OPIOID OVERDOSE!

You can save a life by lending a HAND:

HELP: Call 911

A IRWAY: Give rescue breaths

NALOXONE: Give naloxone. Repeat dose in 2-3 minutes if they do not wake up.

DON'T LEAVE! Wait until 911 help arrives. Do place the person on their side, in case they vomit.

These actions will NOT stop the overdose:

- → DO NOT slap, pinch, burn, or hurt the person
- → DO NOT place the individual in a bathtub with cold water
- → DO NOT inject the person with bleach or any other substance other than naloxone
- → DO NOT let the individual sleep it off
- → **DO NOT** leave the person
